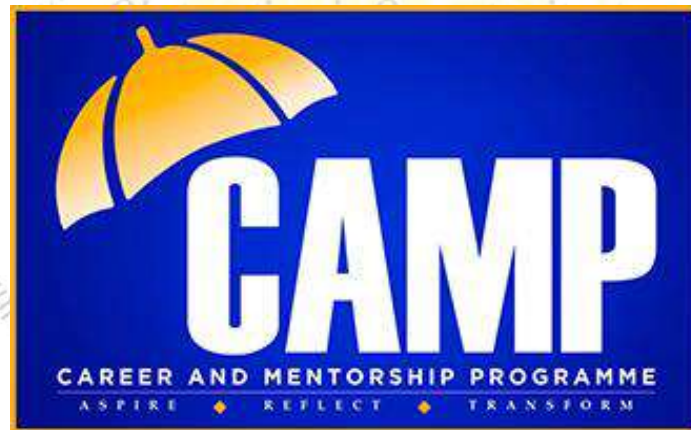

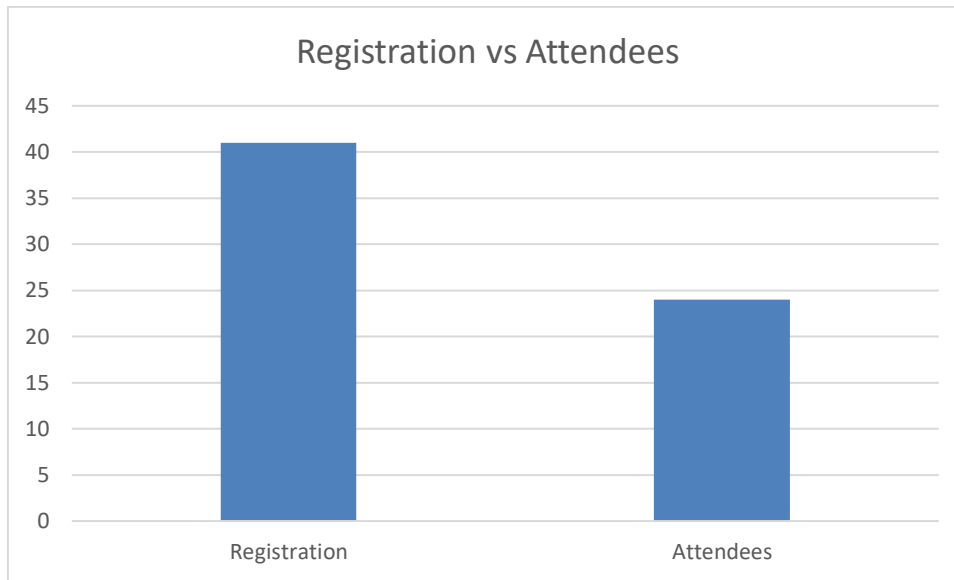
## **SUMMARY**

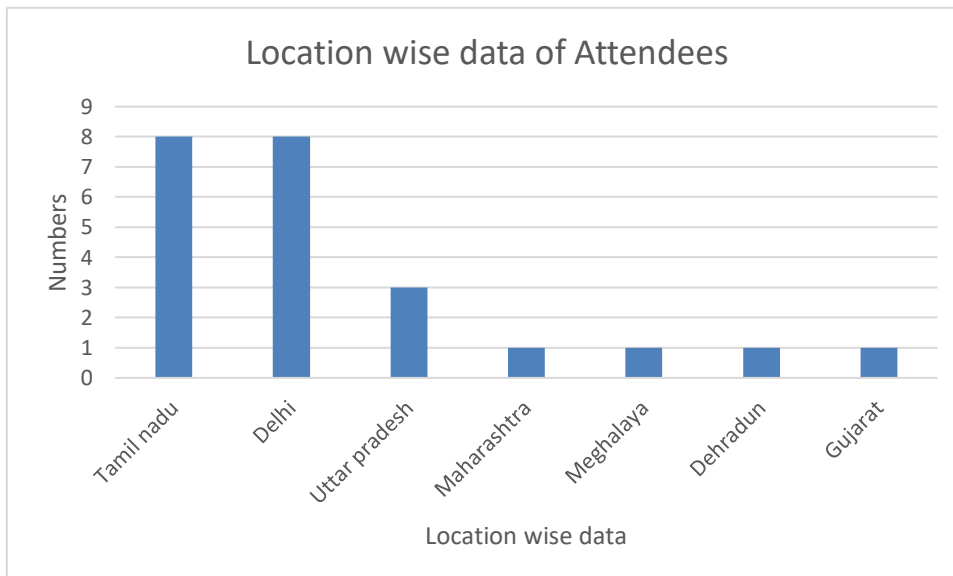

## **HIGHLIGHTS**

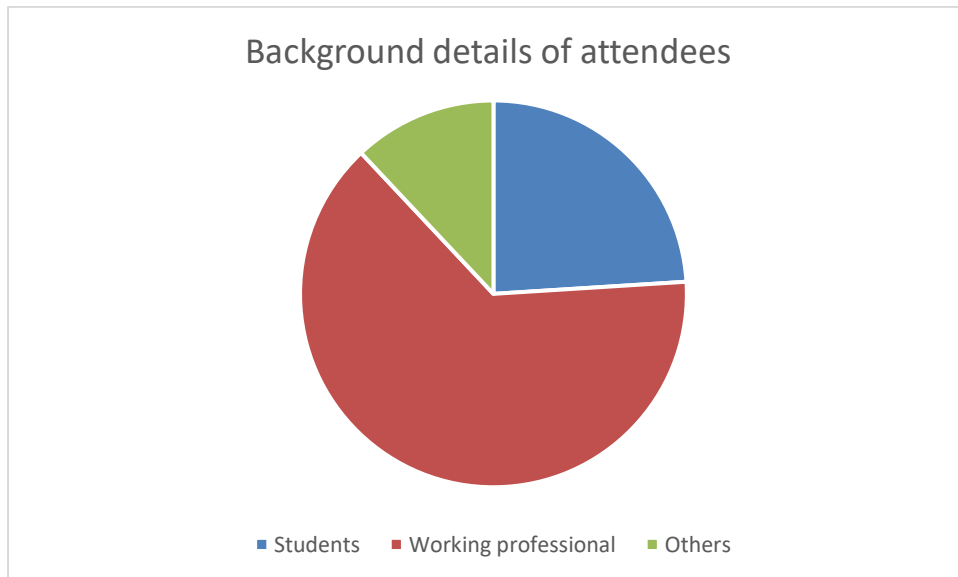
- There were 41 registrations made and 24 attendees attended the session out of which 96% were female and 4% were male.




